# Goals for the Session

- Reflect on who we are and share with others
- Reflect on what we are passionate about, what gives us life
- Reflect on how our passions drive us as leaders
- Reflect on how our passions connect to those of others
- Create a “map” that shows the connections of our passions to ourselves and to the passions of others

# Leadership Passion Mapping and Manifesto

- Create artistic way to see how we perceive leaders/leadership and where our passions in our current roles as leaders or future leaders have influence
- Written proclamation about what concepts, passions, values, ethics, etc., guide you as a leader...what do you hope to leave behind?



# Let's Start With You

- Who are you?
- Write your name down in the middle of your paper...
- Now take a moment to reflect on the following questions and then begin to create your “map”
- Document the answers to the questions to create your “map”
- When you think about positive leaders, who do you think about?
- When have you been labeled as a leader?
- Do you occupy a leadership role now? What is it?
- What drives you in that role?
- When you think about roles you would like to have, what draws you to those roles?

# What Are Your Passions as a Leader?

- Take a moment to reflect on the things that make you...
  - Happy
  - Excited
  - Smile
  - Wake Up in the Morning
  - Feel Good
  - Love What You Do
- What comes to mind?
- Write them down, together, on your paper...
- Turn to someone next to you and share why you are passionate about those 3 things...
- How do these passions connect to your leadership role or to those that you look to hold in the future?



# What are Your Passions cont.

- Take a moment to reflect again on what came up during your share out with your partner...
  - What did you say about why these are your passions?
- Take a moment to write down some notes on the answer to the question.
  - Begin to think about the following questions: How do your passions connect to who you are as a leader? Who you want to be as a leader?

# Connecting the Dots

- How are your passions connected to your leadership?
  - Do you carry your passions with you as you lead?
  - Do they shape your leadership style?
  - Do they drive you to lead the causes/orgs/family groups/the list goes on, that you currently lead?
- How do you see your passion playing a role in developing into the leader you are?
- How have your first ideas about leaders and positive leadership, influenced your passions and the leader you currently are?



# Turning to the Next Page

- Once again turn to someone next to you and share what you are passionate about and how those passions inform your leadership and influence the leader that you are...
- Together, come up with 1-3 ways your passions intertwine with each other...
- How do you see those passions working together towards a common goal?
