





#### The Continuum of Activism

High Level of Participation

#### Traditional Activism:

attending meetings or protests, soliciting donations, education via literature distribution, attending lectures or speeches, volunteering

Think globally, act locally

#### Passive Activism:

making a donation, signing a petition, posting a sign in one's yard, displaying a bumper sticker, subscribing to a newsletter

Think locally, act locally

#### Online Activism:

organizing or attending online events, soliciting online donations, education through via sharing, tagging, tweeting, or emailing, forum and user group participation,

Think globally, act globally

#### Slacktivism:

making an online donation, signing an ePetition, becoming a Fan, joining a Cause or group, displaying a badge or widget, subscribing to an eNewsletter.

# Calling into Action



[Staff] Good afternoon, you have reached the office of [policymaker], how can I help you?

[Constituent] Hello, my name is \_\_\_\_\_, and I'm a constituent of [policymaker]. I am calling in support of/opposition to [issue/bill #]. Does [policymaker] have a position on this issue?

[Staff] [explains position]

[Constituent] [Pick one of three options:]

- [if you AGREE] Thank you. I appreciate your office's leadership on this issue and I hope [policymaker] continues to carry this position.
- [if you DISAGREE] I am sorry to hear that. [Respectfully and succinctly explain your position on the issue in no more than one sentence] I hope that [policymaker] will consider my opinion as one of his/her constituents.
- [if policymaker has NO POSITION]

[Issue/bill #] is important to the constituents of our district for several reasons. [Include no more than three one-sentence reasons to support or oppose the issue or policy.] I hope that [policymaker] will consider my opinion as one of [his/her] constituents and will decide to support/oppose].

[Staff] Thank you, I will take a record of your comment and pass it along to the [policymaker].
