
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
Context before Content

Strengths & Gifts as a Leader

- Personal strengths
- Skills you have developed
- Gifts from your ancestors/communities



Assessing Context: How do you know what strengths, gifts, and skills to use in each context?

- What is the purpose of the context?
- What is your role in the context?
- What is one current goals/issue the context facing?
- What strengths, gifts, and skills would you use in that context to achieve the goal, address the issue, etc.?



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Key Learnings

- You have many tools in your tool box as a leader (don't use a hammer when tweezer would work better)
- Take the time to know the gifts, talents and strengths you bring into the world
- Assess the needs of the different context you exist in
- Matching your strengths to with the needs of each context is authentic leadership and honors you as a complex human being
